### **INQUIRY QUESIONS**

How has our use of water changed over time? Why is water an important resource for all living things?

### **FOCUS ARTWORKS**


Look at the focus artworks and consider and discuss the following questions as a group:

What are the similarities and differences between these different water storage vessels?

► What do you think is the significance of water to these artists? What does water mean to you?







### **MAKING AND RESPONDING**

Using clay, create a water storage vessel for home or personal use.

Consider how the design, patterns and decorations on the vessel will reflect what water means to you.

Share or write a reflection about your water storage vessel.

Display the artwork and reflection for others to view and discuss.
