BEFORE YOUR VISIT

Consider and discuss the following questions as a group:

- ► Think about a natural place that is important to you. This could be your backyard, local park or bushland, the beach, or a place at your school. Why is this place important to you?
- ► What elements of the natural environment make that place special?

Begin making a collection from that place – this collection can include drawings, photographs or samples of natural materials such as leaves.

AFTER YOUR VISIT

Reflect and discuss the important of place for the artists and how they used natural elements and pigments in creating their work.

Make a list of the ways that you could artistically represent the natural environment of your chosen place.

Experiment with different techniques and processes.






Observe the marks and traces fallen leaves make on concrete. Create rubbings from wet leaves onto paper.



Draw leaves and create rubbings using crayons.



Spray watercolour and monoprint leaves. Try layering colours for different effects.



Use <u>crayon resist</u> and add watercolour.




Screenprint leaves.

AFTER YOUR VISIT

Use your collection and experiments to tell a story about place.
